- ◆Develop white paper that includes:
 - A conceptualization of what we mean by “mentoring”
 - Elucidates the range of mentoring practices from “natural” to individualized attention.
 - Distinguish from and elucidate connections to: advising, engagement, support networks, Alfred Hello, etc.
- ◆Consider forming a “mentoring excellence team” with representatives across the university to advise, and to contribute to building project plan and strategies
- ◆Map out mentoring roles and strategies for mentoring
- ◆Enumerate the projects to be explored, evaluated, and implemented, potentially including:
 - Faculty/staff to student mentoring
 - Faculty/staff to faculty/staff mentoring
 - Alumni mentoring for students
 - Peer to peer student mentoring

 - Potentially work with University Advancement on applying for Federal Grants such as TRiO SSS that can help fund a robust mentorship and tutoring program.
